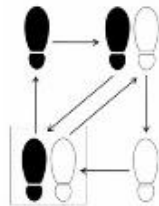
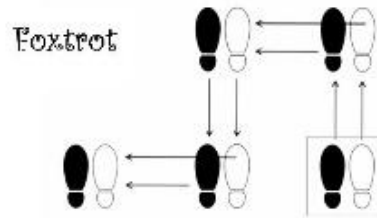


## Dance Program

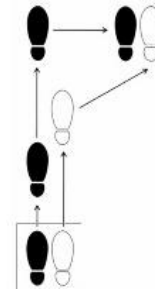
HBDA's dance program emphasizes a relaxed and conversational American Social dance style. There are fifteen (15) chapters that teach the American Social style of Waltz, Viennese Waltz, Fox Trot, Peabody, Tango, Paso Doble, East Coast Swing, Jitterbug and Lindy Hop, West Coast Swing, Swing Hustle, NiteClub Two Step, Cuban Rumba, Bolero, ChaCha, Samba, Merengue, Bachata, Mambo, and Salsa.

International style is taught only at three (3) chapters: Ala Wai, Thursday; Beta, Monday; Kaimuki, Tuesday. Although the technique for dance styles is similar, the International style is more discipline and technical. The International chapters teach Waltz, Viennese Waltz, Fox Trot, Quickstep, Tango, Paso Doble, Rumba, Samba, ChaCha and Jive.

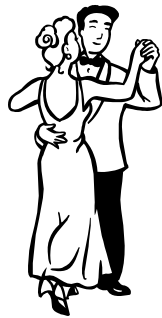
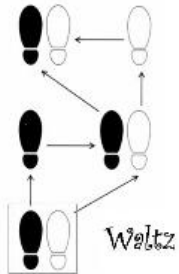

## Dues and Class Fees

Classes run for eight (8) weeks and one (1) social per quarter. Each quarter begin the months of April, July, October and January. Two or three different dances are offered in each session. Dance classes are taught by trained Telemark instructors.

1. All dance students are required to be members of HBDA. Membership dues are \$15 per year (\$10 if joining in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year). All membership expires on March 31.

2. Class fees are \$10 per quarter, per class, per student. Students are required to sign up for a minimum of two (2) classes per quarter.
